Marcus O'Lone, head Land Agent at the Sandringham Estate, phoned me on Wednesday to suggest that we should meet. I have readily agreed, and suggested that it would be appropriate for us to do so once the dust has settled in the New Year. I will discuss with colleagues who should attend this meeting with me.

I mentioned that we would welcome the opportunity to look ahead in terms of restoring good working relations with the Estate, and Mr O'Lone agreed. However, he said that he would also like to cover some basic issues raised by this incident, and principles for working together in the future. He also said that he was 'taken aback by statements made by Natural England, from the Chairman down.'

Meanwhile our staff on the reserve continue to experience very difficult conditions in terms of their relations with Estate workers at the local level, and we will continue to monitor this and support them.
