You could get **sponsored** for doing something, or hold a **sale**, a **raffle** or an **auction**. Or you could charge people to watch a **show**, or enter a **competition** or a special **sporting event**.

#### Show steps

Hold an alternative Fashion Show; with outfits made of bin bags, carrier bags and waste items including boxes and yoghurt pots.

Buy 100 penny lollipops and sell them for 50p each. On some, put a red dot on the bottom of the stick with a pen or nail varnish. Stick the lollipops into a block of polystyrene. Whoever gets a lolly with a dot wins a prize or can enter a raffle.

#### Step up the pace

Divide your class into two teams and give each one a large container. Then challenge one half to collect as many 5p coins as possible. The losing team has to do an embarrassing forfeit, or do all the school chores for a week.

You'd raise even more money if you got all the classes in your school to compete against each other.

Create gourmet lunch boxes to be auctioned. Pay to enter and give prizes for the most creative, nutritious, most humorous etc.

Decorate boxes with themes – ie New York, Noah's Ark etc and create a meal to go with the theme of the box.

#### Foot steps

Organise a fancy dress football match, or a game of football with a rugby ball or sponge ball.



Wear pyjamas to school or work.

#### Pull your socks up!

Wear silly: socks/hats/slippers to work or school; or hold a 'tasteless' ties/tacky jewellery day, or a dress down day.

Make people pay to put their names into a hat and the lucky winner has a virtual 'birthday' with cake and presents and is taken care of all day at work or school.

Let people make a donation of £1 + in honour of someone they admire. It could be a film star, a cartoon character, a footballer, or a prime minister. Let people be as silly as they like and make sure you write the name of the person they chose on a sticky label so they can proudly display who they picked!

Design a your own mini golf area around the office or lobby. Charge people to play and offer a prize for the best player.

Sponsor the clean shaven to 'rough it for a few weeks' and grow a beard, and sponsor those who are already bearded to shave their's off.

Have a one-day 'Lift Toll' and charge anyone who uses the lift.

Take turns to be the office tea slave for the day and get people to make a donation of their choice for each cup they drink.

#### **Future steps**

Recruit executives to disguise themselves as fortune tellers or palm readers and read staff fortunes; or have an authentic palm reader who will donate their services for free.

Get the men in your office to have a race to see who can iron the most shirts in a certain amount of time. Make a trophy or medal for the winner. Pay to watch or sponsor them for each shirt they iron, or race men against women.

Organise a departmental pizza party.

#### Foot note

Remember: Collections are no problem if they are on private property, for instance, in schools or offices etc. Here you can pass round a bucket without any worries. BUT you need a licence to collect on public property which is a big nuisance. So think of something else!

#### Foot the bill!

This one's for hairdressers, cabbies, restaurant staff and anyone else who receives tips at work. Make sure you step up the pace at work throughout Appeal Week and then donate your tips to BBC Children in Need!

Auction parking spaces for the day.
