 - b. cloud - Wrong – you can use the correct answer on a bed.
 - c. milk - Wrong – we don't usually use 'a' with milk.

2. Do you have any painkillers? I've got a ... headache.
 - a. heavy - Wrong – you might have a heavy cold, but not a heavy headache.
 - c. cutting - Wrong – you need a word with a similar but stronger meaning.
 - d. smashing - Wrong – this would mean that your headache is very good!

3. No dinner for me, I can't keep my food ...
 - a. in - Wrong – you need the opposite of up.
 - c. off - Wrong – you need the opposite of up.
 - d. until - Wrong – use this when you talk about time or distance.

4. Have you got an ... stomach?
 - a. ill - Wrong – you may be ill, but you need a different word to describe your stomach not being calm or settled.
 - b. angry - Wrong – the correct answer can have a similar meaning to 'angry'.
 - d. up and down - Wrong – your mood may go up and down, but not your stomach.

5. Oh dear, pass the paper bag, I'm going to ... sick.
 - a. feel - Wrong – you can say 'I feel sick' but not 'I am going to feel sick'.
 - c. throw - Wrong – You can say 'throw up' but not 'throw sick'.
 - d. have - Wrong – you can have an ache or pain, but not sick.

6. My head is ..., do I look ..?
 - a. spinning/white - Wrong – you need a different word for 'white'.
 - b. turning/pale - Wrong – you need a different word for 'turning'.
 - c. twisting/white - Wrong – you need different words for 'turning' and 'white'.
